

Statement of Mr. Hidenobu Sobashima, Ambassador of Japan to the  
Republic of Zambia at the Handover Ceremony of a Water Supply System in  
Mangango, Kaoma District, Western Province, on 2 March 2018

Ladies and Gentlemen,

It is my honour and pleasure to represent the Government of Japan, at this handover ceremony of a Water Supply System in Mangango, Kaoma District, Western Province.

TICAD VI, held in Nairobi, Kenya, in August 2016, attached importance to promoting resilient health systems for quality of life, to create “Resilient Africa”, among other priority issues.

Safe drinking water is one of the important elements of public health and Resilient Africa.

According to the data collected at Health Centre in Mangango, only about 40% of about 12,000 residents of Mangango had access to hand pumps, and majority of the residents depended on the Luena River for the water for their living.

That had prevented many people, particularly women and children, in the area from taking part in productive activities and attending schools, as they had to spend a lot of their time and labor for collecting water.

What is worse, many people suffered from such diseases as diarrhoea, and skin, eye and respiratory infections, due to the lack of safe drinking water.

Under the circumstances, Village Water Zambia prepared a proposal to construct a Water Supply System in Mangango, and requested the Government of Japan to assist it.

We considered and decided to extend up to US\$ 197, 894 or 1,890,878  
Zambian Kwacha for this purpose.

The water purification machine, the filter media, and the solar powered system were produced by a Japanese company Yamaha Motor Company Ltd., which has constructed the System and offered the training for its maintenance.

With the completion of this project, 8,112 people of 1,352 families as well as other people, from outside the communities, who visit here, will have access to the safe drinking water from this Water Supply System.

I hope that this Water Supply System will be effectively utilized to benefit the people in Mangango Area for a long time, and will develop to become a symbol of friendship between Zambia and Japan.
