Refugees get \$1m Japan aid

THE Japanese government has allocated US\$1 million for the improvement of refugees' welfare and integration into society of former refugees at

Mayukwayukwa Camp.

Japanese Ambassador to Zambia Hidenobu Sobashima said his overnment last year released over US\$2 million to the United Nations (UN) agencies to help in addressing the challenges that the refugees and former refugees were facing.

Mr Sobashima said this on Thursday when he toured some Japanese funded projects at Mayukwayukwa Refugee

Camp in Kaoma.

"We appreciate and admire the efforts of the Zambian government in accepting refugees and former refugees from various countries," Mr Sobashima said.

He said the Zambian government through the United Nations High Commissioner for Refugees (UNHCR) spent US\$11.3 million between 2012 and 2016 courtesy of the Japanese government on refugees programmes in the country.

He commended Government for implementing the local integration programme under which long-term immigrants from Angola and Rwanda, were recognised as former refugees to sustainably resettle them.

Mr Sobashima urged the UN agencies to put the funds to good use by addressing the challenges that the refugees and former refugees are facing.

And Ministry of Lands and Natural Resources Western Province acting land resettlement officer Barbara Chimbwe said about 1,336 plots where allocated to both Zambians and former refugees under the local integration programme.

And Ministry of Home Affairs representative Solomon Mulenga said the ministry has received a total of 3,445 applications for residence permits from 2012 to March 1, this year, of which, 362 refugees have been issued with documents

And UNHCR assistant durable solutions officer Maureen Namwanyi thanked the Japanese government for the financial support towards refugees.

Ms Namwanyi said the agency will ensure that the funds are used for the intended purpose of resettling former refugees at Mayukwayukwa and Kenani Refugee camps in Kaoma and Nchelenge, respectively.
