Statement of Mr. Hidenobu Sobashima, Ambassador of Japan to the Republic of Zambia at the Handover Ceremony of a New Science Laboratory at Kasisi Girls' Secondary School in Chongwe, Lusaka Province on Tuesday 23 October 2018

It is my honour and pleasure to represent the Government of Japan at this Handover Ceremony of a New Science Laboratory at Kasisi Girls' Secondary School in Chongwe, Lusaka Province.

TICAD VI, held in Nairobi, Kenya, in August 2016, attached importance to human resources development to promote economic diversification and industrialization in Africa to create "Quality Africa", among other priority issues.

We appreciate the activities of Kasisi Girls' Secondary School, which currently accommodates about 430 girls at Grades 8 to 12, particularly for its education not only for vulnerable girls in Kasisi area but also for orphan girls throughout Zambia having them stay and learn at the school.

However, as the school did not have an appropriate science laboratory, it had challenges in relation to the curricula of the Ministry of General Education.

Thus the building of a new science laboratory in the school was hoped for and the school requested Japan to assist its construction.

We considered and decided to extend up to US\$ 91,613 (877,569 Kwacha) for the construction of a new science laboratory building with three experiment rooms and for procuring the necessary furniture and equipment, and Sr. Phiri and I signed a grant contract for this purpose in February last year.

With the completion of a new science laboratory, the girl students at Kasisi Girls' Secondary School are now able to conduct appropriate scientific experiments.

I hope that with the new science laboratory, Kasisi Girls' Secondary School will contribute to human resources development in Zambia, and creating "Quality Zambia", and thus to develop to become a symbol of friendship between Zambia and Japan.
