said the authority would soon come up with regulations on how people should be promoted to become professors to ensure that the professorship was guided accordingly. He said if the promotion of the professors was

not recognised, it would have an impact on their grading and assessment. The authority would come up with strategic plans as roadmap to improve service delivery and safeguard the title of professor, he said.
