"PARKS" is a story which evolves in Inokashira Park in Tokyo, where Haru, a girl who searches for her late father's past will meet a grandson of the girlfriend of her father, and they will try to revive the music their father and grandmother played. Then something unexpected will happen. I stop here.

I hope that you will enjoy the Japanese film and will return home safely, hopefully with better appreciation of Japan and at least better understanding of Japan.
