Remarks by H.E. Mr. TAKEUCHI Kazuyuki, Ambassador of Japan to the Republic of Zambia, at the Ceremony of Exchange of Notes on Japan's Grant Aid for "The Project for the Improvement of Exhibition Equipment at the Livingstone Museum"
