

Zambia and Japan forged diplomatic ties soon after the then Northern Rhodesia gained its independence from the U.K. in 1964.

24 October 1964, Zambia's Independence Day, coincided with the closing day of the Tokyo Olympics. The Zambian team, which participated in the opening ceremony as Northern Rhodesia, proudly raised the brand-new Zambian national flag in the closing ceremony. Japan witnessed this historic moment as the Olympic host country.

In 2024 the two countries commemorate 60 years of bilateral cooperation with various commemorative events to mark the Diamond Jubilee.


