Remarks of Mr. TAKEUCHI Kazuyuki Ambassador of Japan to the Republic of Zambia At the Premiere Evening of Japan Film Festival 2024 At Ster-Kinekor Manda Hill Mall, Lusaka Saturday, 3 February 2024

Hon. Rodney Sikumba, Minister of Tourism of the Republic of Zambia, Distinguished Guests, Ladies and Gentlemen,

Allow me to welcome you all to the Premiere Evening of Japan Film Festival 2024. I am greatly honoured to be here with you. Thank you all for taking your time to come and celebrate Japanese culture through film.

This year, Zambia and Japan are commemorating 60 years of bilateral relations of friendship and cooperation. This is more important when we recall the fact that Zambia celebrates same 60 years of independence in this 2024. Our Embassy will organise various commemorative events throughout 2024 to mark the Diamond Jubilee between the two countries.
