Required Documents for Shot-term Visa

Visa Application Form (Sample)

One recent color photograph (45mm x 35mm, front-facing) must be attached thereto.

- Passport (valid for at least six months beyond your intended date of departure from Japan)
- Travel itinerary or a written guarantee from your travel agent confirming your return date to Zambia
- Letter from your company OR organization stating:
 - O the nature of the business you intend to conduct in Japan;
 - O the planned duration of your stay; and
 - O **for tourism purposes**, that you are approved by your company OR organization for your leave of absence from work; OR
 - O **for business purposes**, the name and address of the company OR organization you will be dealing with in Japan.
- Proof of your reservation for accommodation in Japan, OR a written guarantee from your guarantor/inviter to provide accommodation for you in Japan during your period of stay.
- Bank statement

The statement must prove all transactions within the last three months from the application date, to prove that you have sufficient funds available. If your guarantor/inviter pays for your finance for your travel including accommodation, foods etc., his/her valid bank statement and tax certificate might be requested.

- <u>Letter of Guarantee (English)</u> **OR** <u>Letter of Guarantee (Japanese)</u>, if your host guarantees: 1. expenses for the applicant's stay in Japan; 2. return travel expenses; and 3. compliance with Japanese laws and regulations.
 - A copy of a valid certificate (Residence Card OR Certificate of Residence) of your guarantor/inviter might be requested.
- <u>Letter of Invitation (English)</u> OR <u>Letter of Invitation (Japanese)</u>, if you are invited.
 A copy of a valid certificate (Residence Card OR Certificate of Residence) of your guarantor/inviter might be requested.

In addition,

For a Zambian Applicant:

Photo identification issued by the Zambian authorities
 (e.g. your original National Registration Card OR Driver's License)

For a non-Zambian Applicant

Work Permit OR Residence Permit issued by the Zambian authorities

This must remain valid for at least six months from your intended date of departure for Japan.
