REMARKS BY H.E. MR. KIYOSHI KOINUMA, AMBASSADOR OF JAPAN ON THE OCCASION OF THE HAND OVER CEREMONY OF JAPANESE TELEVISION PROGRAMMES TO MUVI TELEVISION, 12th February 2015

Mr. Costa Muwemsa, General Manager of MUVI Television, Members of the Press, Ladies and Gentlemen.

It is my great pleasure to be here today on behalf of the Government of Japan and the Japan Foundation at this handover ceremony for a Japanese Television program.

The Japan Foundation is offering international versions of Japanese television programs to overseas television stations with a view to introducing Japanese culture or cultural values by covering the broadcast rights fee and the production cost for audio-visual materials.

The story has a rich background of Japanese beautiful scenery and traditional culture, such as the tea ceremony, the art of flower arrangement and Kimono as well as the spirit of Japanese hospitality. It is my hope that the drama will transport the audience to Japan and afford them a rich and meaningful cultural experience.

It is my earnest hope that the provision of Japanese drama will expand the cordial relationship between Japan and Zambia by enhancing mutual understanding of each culture. Moreover, it is my sincere wish that the audience use this opportunity not only for entertainment but also as a spring board for learning.
